John 1:17

For the law was given through Moses, [but] grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.

## **MOSES & THE LAW: The Law Was Given Through Moses**

### \_ : The Law Was an Introduction and Representation of What Was to Follow

(Heb 10:1-12) <sup>1</sup> For the law, having a shadow of the good things to come, *and* not the very image of the things, can never with these same sacrifices, which they offer continually year by year, make those who approach perfect. <sup>2</sup> For then would they not have ceased to be offered? For the worshipers, once purified, would have had no more consciousness of sins. <sup>3</sup> But in those *sacrifices there is* a reminder of sins every year. <sup>4</sup> For *it is* not possible that the blood of bulls and goats could take away sins. <sup>5</sup> Therefore, when He came into the world, He said: "Sacrifice and offering You did not desire, But a body You have prepared for Me. <sup>6</sup> In burnt offerings and *sacrifices* for sin You had no pleasure. <sup>7</sup> Then I said, Behold, I have comell the volume of the book it is written of Me-- To do Your will, O God." <sup>8</sup> Previously saying, "Sacrifice and offering, burnt offerings, and *offerings* for sin You did not desire, nor had pleasure *in them*" (which are offered according to the law), <sup>9</sup> then He said, "Behold, I have come to do Your will, O God." He takes away the first that He may establish the second. <sup>10</sup> By that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once *for all.* <sup>11</sup> And every priest stands ministering daily and offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. <sup>12</sup> But this Man, after He had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down at the right hand of God,

# : The Law Was a Tutor to Bring Us to Christ

(Gal 3:21-24) <sup>21</sup> Is the law then against the promises of God? Certainly not! For if there had been a law given which could have given life, truly righteousness would have been by the law. <sup>22</sup> But the Scripture has confined all under sin, that the promise by faith in Jesus Christ might be given to those who believe. <sup>23</sup> But before faith came, we were kept under guard by the law, kept for the faith which would afterward be revealed. <sup>24</sup> Therefore the law was our tutor *to bring us* to Christ, that we might be justified by faith.

### : The Law Was a Revealer to Make Us Aware of Our Sin

(Rom 3:19-20) <sup>19</sup> Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become guilty before God. <sup>20</sup> Therefore by the deeds of the law no flesh will be justified in His sight, for by the law *is* the knowledge of sin.

(Rom 3:27-31) <sup>27</sup> Where *is* boasting then? It is excluded. By what law? Of works? No, but by the law of faith. <sup>28</sup> Therefore we conclude that a man is justified by faith apart from the deeds of the law. <sup>29</sup> Or *is He* the God of the Jews only? *Is He* not also the God of the Gentiles? Yes, of the Gentiles also, <sup>30</sup> since *there is* one God who will justify the circumcised by faith and the uncircumcised through faith. <sup>31</sup> Do we then make void the law through faith? Certainly not! On the contrary, we establish the law.

(Rom 4:15) because the law brings about wrath; for where there is no law there is no transgression.

(Rom 5:20) Moreover the law entered that the offense might abound. But where sin abounded, grace abounded much more,

(Gal 2:16) knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law but by faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, that we might be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law; for by the works of the law no flesh shall be justified.

(Gal 3:10-12) <sup>10</sup> For as many as are of the works of the law are under the curse; for it is written, "Cursed *is* everyone who does not continue in all things which are written in the book of the law, to do them." <sup>11</sup> But that no one is justified by the law in the sight of God *is* evident, for "the just shall live by faith." <sup>12</sup> Yet the law is not of faith, but "the man who does them shall live by them."

(1 Tim 1:5-11) <sup>5</sup> Now the purpose of the commandment is love from a pure heart, *from* a good conscience, and *from* sincere faith, <sup>6</sup> from which some, having strayed, have turned aside to idle talk, <sup>7</sup> desiring to be teachers of the law, understanding neither what they say nor the things which they affirm. <sup>8</sup> But we know that the law *is* good if one uses it lawfully, <sup>9</sup> knowing this: that the law is not made for a righteous person, but for *the* lawless and insubordinate, for *the* ungodly and for sinners, for *the* unholy and profane, for murderers of fathers and murderers of mothers, for manslayers, <sup>10</sup> for fornicators, for sodomites, for kidnappers, for liars, for perjurers, and if there is any other thing that is contrary to sound doctrine, <sup>11</sup> according to the glorious gospel of the blessed God which was committed to my trust.

## JESUS & GRACE & TRUTH: Grace and Truth "Became" Through Jesus Christ

(Matt 5:17-18) "Do not think that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill. <sup>18</sup> "For assuredly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, one jot or one tittle will by no means pass from the law till all is fulfilled.

### The \_\_\_\_\_\_ : Jesus Came to Rescue Us from the Results of Sin and the Law

(John 5:46) For if you believed Moses, you would believe Me; for he wrote about Me.

(Acts 3:22) "For Moses truly said to the fathers, The LORD your God will raise up for you a Prophet like me from your brethren. Him you shall hear in all things, whatever He says to you.


(Eph 1:7) In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace

(Eph 2:8) For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God,

(Col 1:5-6) <sup>5</sup> because of the hope which is laid up for you in heaven, of which you heard before in the word of the truth of the gospel, <sup>6</sup> which has come to you, as *it has* also in all the world, and is bringing forth fruit, as *it is* also among you since the day you heard and knew the grace of God in truth:

(Titus 2:11) For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men,

(Heb 2:9) But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels, for the suffering of death crowned with glory and honor, that He, by the grace of God, might taste death for everyone.

(John 4:24) "God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth."

(John 8:32) "And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free."

John 14:6) Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.

(John 17:17 Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth.

(Col 1:5) because of the hope which is laid up for you in heaven, of which you heard before in the word of the truth of the gospel,

(2 Thes 2:12) that they all may be condemned who did not believe the truth but had pleasure in unrighteousness.

(1 Tim 2:4) who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.

(2 Tim 2:15) Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.

(1 John 2:4) He who says, "I know Him," and does not keep His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him.
