- Luke 12:15 And He said to them, "Take heed and beware of covetousness, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of the things he possesses."
- 1 Cor 15:58 Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always <u>abounding</u> in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord.

- 1 Thes 3:2 and sent Timothy, our brother and minister of God, and our fellow laborer in the gospel of Christ, to <u>establish</u> you and encourage you concerning your faith,
- 2 Thes 2:17 comfort your hearts and establish you in every good word and work.
- 2 Thes 3:3 But the Lord is faithful, who will <u>establish</u> you and guard you from the evil one.

ἄμεμπτος [amemptos] blameless, faultless

- Job 1:8 Then the LORD said to Satan, "Have you considered My servant Job, that there is none like him on the earth, a <u>blameless</u> and upright man, one who fears God and shuns evil?" (cf. 2:3; 4:17; 9:20; 11:14)
- Luke 1:6 And they [Zacharias and Elisabeth] were both righteous before God, walking in all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord <u>blameless</u>.
- Phil 2:15 that you may become <u>blameless</u> and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world,

άγιωσύνη [hagiosune] holiness; consecration

• 2 Cor 7:1 Therefore, having these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God.

ἀγιασμός [hagiasmos] consecration, dedication, sanctification, holiness

Rom 6:19 I speak in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh. For
just as you presented your members as slaves of uncleanness, and of
lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present your members as
slaves of righteousness for holiness. (1 Thes 4:3,4 sanctification; 7 holiness)
