

## Jesus Wants You to *Waste* Your Life (Luke 9:24-25)

### 1. We Are to Affirm Jesus' Special \_\_\_\_\_

<sup>18</sup> And it happened, as He was alone praying, *that* His disciples joined Him, and He asked them, saying, "Who do the crowds say that I am?"

<sup>19</sup> So they answered and said, "John the Baptist, but some say Elijah; and others say that one of the old prophets has risen again."

<sup>20</sup> He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?"

Peter answered and said, "The Christ of God."

### 2. We Are to Believe Jesus' Substitutionary \_\_\_\_\_

<sup>21</sup> And He strictly warned and commanded them to tell this to no one,

<sup>22</sup> saying, "The Son of Man must (*dei*) suffer many things, and be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised the third day."

### 3. We Are to Embrace Our Reasonable \_\_\_\_\_

<sup>23</sup> Then He said to *them* all, "If anyone **desires** to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me.

a. Deny (x!) Yourself: Say \_\_\_\_\_ to Self

b. Take Up (x!) Your Cross Daily: Say \_\_\_\_\_ to Death

c. Be Following (~!) Jesus: Continually \_\_\_\_\_ Jesus

### 4. We Are to Understand the Logic of Present \_\_\_\_\_

<sup>24</sup> "For whoever **desires** to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake will save it.

a. Seeking to \_\_\_\_\_ your life will only \_\_\_\_\_ it

<sup>25</sup> "For what profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world, and is himself destroyed or lost?"

a. All that can possibly be gained in this life is eternal \_\_\_\_\_

b. There are only \_\_\_\_\_ possible ways to live your life:

Rom. 14:10-12 But why do you judge your brother? Or why do you show contempt for your brother? For we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ. <sup>11</sup> For it is written: "As I live, says the LORD, Every knee shall bow to Me, And every tongue shall confess to God." <sup>12</sup> So then each of us shall give account of himself to God.

2 Cor. 5:10 For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things *done* in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad.

1 Cor. 3:12-15 Now if anyone builds on this foundation *with* gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw, <sup>13</sup> each one's work will become clear; for the Day will declare it, because it will be revealed by fire; and the fire will test each one's work, of what sort it is. <sup>14</sup> If anyone's work which he has built on *it* endures, he will receive a reward. <sup>15</sup> If anyone's work is burned, he will **suffer loss**; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire.

Rev 22:12 "Behold, I am coming quickly, and My reward is with Me, to render to every man according to what he has done.

- Living for \_\_\_\_\_, and gaining eternal rewards & blessings

Matt. 16:24-27 <sup>27</sup> "For the Son of Man will come in the glory of His Father with His angels, and then He will reward each according to his works.

Heb. 10:35-39 Therefore do not cast away your confidence, which has great reward.

<sup>36</sup> For you have need of endurance, so that after you have done the will of God, you may receive the promise: <sup>37</sup> "For yet a little while, *And* He who is coming will come and will not tarry. <sup>38</sup> Now the just shall live by faith; But if *anyone* draws back, My soul has no pleasure in him." <sup>39</sup> But we are not of those who draw back to perdition, but of those who believe to the saving (*peripoiesin*) of the soul.

Heb. 11:23-26 By faith Moses, when he became of age, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, <sup>25</sup> choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin, <sup>26</sup> esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt; for he looked to the reward.

Heb. 12:1-2 Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares *us*, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, <sup>2</sup> looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of *our* faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.
