<p>¹ Now the LORD spoke to Moses and Aaron, saying to them, ² "Speak to the children of Israel, saying, "These <i>are</i> the animals which you may eat among all the animals that <i>are</i> on the earth:</p>	<p>1. God Directs Israel's _____</p>
<p>³ Among the animals, whatever divides the hoof, having cloven hooves <i>and</i> chewing the cud-- that you may eat.</p>	<p>2. The Bottom Lines – 2 _____</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Divides the _____ • Chews the _____
<p>⁴ Nevertheless these you shall not eat among those that chew the cud or those that have cloven hooves: the camel, because it chews the cud but does not have cloven hooves, is unclean to you; ⁵ the rock hyrax, because it chews the cud but does not have cloven hooves, <i>is</i> unclean to you; ⁶ the hare, because it chews the cud but does not have cloven hooves, <i>is</i> unclean to you; ⁷ and the swine, though it divides the hoof, having cloven hooves, yet does not chew the cud, <i>is</i> unclean to you. ⁸ Their flesh you shall not eat, and their carcasses you shall not touch. They <i>are</i> unclean to you.</p>	<p>3. Those That Do Not Have Both = _____</p>
<p>⁹ These you may eat of all that <i>are</i> in the water: whatever in the water has fins and scales, whether in the seas or in the rivers-- that you may eat. ¹⁰ But all in the seas or in the rivers that do not have fins and scales, all that move in the water or any living thing which <i>is</i> in the water, they <i>are</i> an abomination to you. ¹¹ They shall be an abomination to you; you shall not eat their flesh, but you shall regard their carcasses as an abomination. ¹² Whatever in the water does not have fins or scales-- that <i>shall be</i> an abomination to you.</p>	<p>4. Two Rules for Fish: _____ & _____</p>
<p>¹³ And these you shall regard as an abomination among the birds; they shall not be eaten, they <i>are</i> an abomination: the eagle, the vulture, the buzzard, ¹⁴ the kite, and the falcon after its kind; ¹⁵ every raven after its kind, ¹⁶ the ostrich, the short-eared owl, the sea gull, and the hawk after its kind; ¹⁷ the little owl, the fisher owl, and the screech owl; ¹⁸ the white owl, the jackdaw, and the carrion vulture; ¹⁹ the stork, the heron after its kind, the hoopoe, and the bat.</p>	<p>5. _____ You Cannot Eat</p>
<p>²⁰ All flying insects that creep on <i>all fours shall be</i> an abomination to you. ²¹ Yet these you may eat of every flying insect that creeps on <i>all fours</i>: those which have jointed legs above their feet with which to leap on the earth. ²² These you may eat: the locust after its kind, the destroying locust after its kind, the cricket after its kind, and the grasshopper after its kind. ²³ But all <i>other</i> flying insects which have four feet <i>shall be</i> an abomination to you.</p>	<p>6. _____ You Can and Cannot Eat</p>
<p>²⁴ By these you shall become unclean; whoever touches the carcass of any of them shall be unclean until evening; ²⁵ whoever carries part of the carcass of any of them shall wash his clothes and be unclean until evening. ²⁶ <i>The carcass</i> of any animal which divides the foot, but is not cloven-hoofed or does not chew the cud, <i>is</i> unclean to you. Everyone who touches it shall be unclean. ²⁷ And whatever goes on its paws, among all kinds of animals that go on <i>all fours</i>, those <i>are</i> unclean to you. Whoever touches any such carcass shall be unclean until evening. ²⁸ Whoever carries <i>any such</i> carcass shall wash his clothes and be unclean until evening. It <i>is</i> unclean to you.</p>	<p>7. Touching _____ of Unclean Animals</p>
<p>²⁹ These also <i>shall be</i> unclean to you among the creeping things that creep on the earth: the mole, the mouse, and the large lizard after its kind; ³⁰ the gecko, the monitor lizard, the sand reptile, the sand lizard, and the chameleon. ³¹ These <i>are</i> unclean to you among all that creep. Whoever touches them when they are dead shall be unclean until evening.</p>	<p>8. Unclean _____ Things</p>
<p>³² Anything on which <i>any</i> of them falls, when they are dead shall be unclean, whether <i>it is</i> any item of wood or clothing or skin or sack, whatever item <i>it is</i>, in which <i>any</i> work is done, it must be put in water. And it shall be unclean until evening; then it shall be clean. ³³ Any earthen vessel into which <i>any</i> of them falls you shall break; and whatever <i>is</i> in it shall be unclean: ³⁴ in such a vessel, any edible food upon which water falls becomes unclean, and any drink that may be drunk from it becomes unclean. ³⁵ And everything on which <i>a part of any such</i> carcass falls shall be unclean; <i>whether it is</i> an oven or cooking stove, it shall be broken down; <i>for they are</i> unclean, and shall be unclean to you.</p>	<p>9. What If Something Unclean _____ ?</p>

<p>³⁶ ` Nevertheless a spring or a cistern, <i>in which there is</i> plenty of water, shall be clean, but whatever touches any such carcass becomes unclean.</p>	<p>10. An _____</p>
<p>³⁷ ` And if a part of <i>any such</i> carcass falls on any planting seed which is to be sown, it <i>remains</i> clean. ³⁸ ` But if water is put on the seed, and if <i>a part of any such</i> carcass falls on it, it <i>becomes</i> unclean to you.</p>	<p>11. What About _____ ?</p>
<p>³⁹ ` And if any animal which you may eat dies, he who touches its carcass shall be unclean until evening. ⁴⁰ ` He who eats of its carcass shall wash his clothes and be unclean until evening. He also who carries its carcass shall wash his clothes and be unclean until evening.</p>	<p>12. Clean Animals that Have _____ ?</p>
<p>⁴¹ ` And every creeping thing that creeps on the earth <i>shall be</i> an abomination. It shall not be eaten. ⁴² ` Whatever crawls on its belly, whatever goes on <i>all</i> fours, or whatever has many feet among all creeping things that creep on the earth-- these you shall not eat, for they <i>are</i> an abomination. ⁴³ ` You shall not make yourselves abominable with any creeping thing that creeps; nor shall you make yourselves unclean with them, lest you be defiled by them.</p>	<p>13. More Unclean _____ Things</p>
<p>⁴⁴ ` For I <i>am</i> the LORD your God. You shall therefore consecrate yourselves, and you shall be holy; for I <i>am</i> holy. Neither shall you defile yourselves with any creeping thing that creeps on the earth. ⁴⁵ ` For I <i>am</i> the LORD who brings you up out of the land of Egypt, to be your God. You shall therefore be holy, for I <i>am</i> holy.</p>	<p>14. Reason #1: God Is Holy – I Am to Be _____</p>
<p>⁴⁶ ` This <i>is</i> the law of the animals and the birds and every living creature that moves in the waters, and of every creature that creeps on the earth, ⁴⁷ ` to distinguish between the unclean and the clean, and between the animal that may be eaten and the animal that may not be eaten."</p>	<p>15.
