Why did you not come to me? Am I not able to honor you?" ³⁸ And Balaam said to Balak, "Look, I have come to you! Now, have I any power at all to say anything? - ³ Then Balaam said to Balak, "Stand by your burnt offering, and I will go; perhaps the LORD will come to meet me, and whatever He shows me I will tell you." So he went to a desolate height. ⁴ And God met Balaam, and he said to Him, "I have prepared the seven altars, and I have offered on *each* altar a bull and a ram." ⁵ Then the LORD put a word in Balaam's mouth, and said, "Return to Balak, and thus you shall speak."
- ⁶ So he returned to him, and there he was, standing by his burnt offering, he and all the princes of Moab. ⁷ And he took up his oracle and said: "Balak the king of Moab has brought me from Aram, From the mountains of the east. 'Come, curse Jacob for me, And come, denounce Israel!' ⁸ "How shall I curse whom God has not cursed? And how shall I denounce *whom* the LORD has not denounced? ⁹ For from the top of the rocks I see him, And from the hills I behold him; There! A people dwelling alone, Not reckoning itself among the nations. ¹⁰ "Who can count the dust of Jacob, Or number one-fourth of Israel? Let me die the death of the righteous, And let my end be like his!"
