

### Timeline of Truth – God Remembers Noah (Genesis 8:1-19)

<p><sup>7:11</sup> In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, in the <b>second month</b>, the <b>seventeenth day</b> of the month, on that day all the fountains of the great deep were broken up, and the windows of heaven were opened.</p>	
<p><sup>7:24</sup> And the waters prevailed on the earth <b>one hundred and fifty days</b>.</p>	
<p><sup>1</sup> Then God remembered Noah, and every living thing, and all the animals that <i>were</i> with him in the ark. And God made a wind to pass over the earth, and the waters subsided.</p>	
<p><sup>2</sup> The fountains of the deep and the windows of heaven were also stopped, and the rain from heaven was restrained.</p>	
<p><sup>3</sup> And the waters receded continually from the earth. At the end of the <b>hundred and fifty days</b> the waters decreased.</p>	
<p><sup>4</sup> Then the ark rested in the <b>seventh month</b>, the <b>seventeenth day</b> of the month, on the mountains of Ararat.</p>	
<p><sup>5</sup> And the waters decreased continually until the tenth month. In the <b>tenth month</b>, on the <b>first day</b> of the month, the tops of the mountains were seen.</p>	
<p><sup>6</sup> So it came to pass, at the end of <b>forty days</b>, that Noah opened the window of the ark which he had made.</p>	
<p><sup>7</sup> Then he sent out a raven, which kept going to and fro until the waters had dried up from the earth. <sup>8</sup> He also sent out from himself a dove, to see if the waters had receded from the face of the ground. <sup>9</sup> But the dove found no resting place for the sole of her foot, and she returned into the ark to him, for the waters <i>were</i> on the face of the whole earth. So he put out his hand and took her, and drew her into the ark to himself.</p>	
<p><sup>10</sup> And he waited yet <b>another seven days</b>, and again he sent the dove out from the ark. <sup>11</sup> Then the dove came to him in the evening, and behold, a freshly plucked olive leaf <i>was</i> in her mouth; and Noah knew that the waters had receded from the earth.</p>	
<p><sup>12</sup> So he waited yet <b>another seven days</b> and sent out the dove, which did not return again to him anymore.</p>	
<p><sup>13</sup> And it came to pass in the six hundred and first year, in the <b>first month</b>, the <b>first day</b> of the month, that the waters were dried up from the earth; and Noah removed the covering of the ark and looked, and indeed the surface of the ground was dry.</p>	
<p><sup>14</sup> And in the <b>second month</b>, on the <b>twenty-seventh day</b> of the month, the earth was dried.</p>	
<p><sup>15</sup> Then God spoke to Noah, saying, <sup>16</sup> "Go out of the ark, you and your wife, and your sons and your sons' wives with you. <sup>17</sup> "Bring out with you every living thing of all flesh that <i>is</i> with you: birds and cattle and every creeping thing that creeps on the earth, so that they may abound on the earth, and be fruitful and multiply on the earth." <sup>18</sup> So Noah went out, and his sons and his wife and his sons' wives with him. <sup>19</sup> Every animal, every creeping thing, every bird, <i>and whatever</i> creeps on the earth, according to their families, went out of the ark.</p>
