

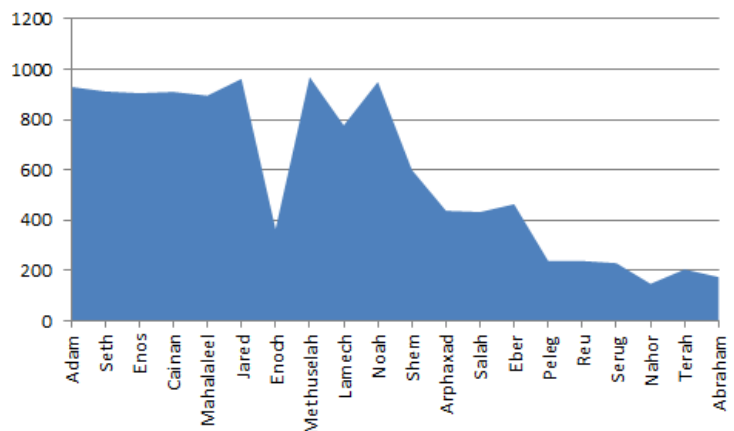
**Timeline of Truth – Shem to Abram (Genesis 11:10-32)**

| <b>1</b>   | <p><sup>3</sup> And <b>Adam</b> lived one hundred and thirty years, and begot <i>a son</i> in his own likeness, after his image, and named him Seth.</p> <p><sup>4</sup> After he begot Seth, the days of Adam were eight hundred years; and he had sons and daughters.</p> <p><sup>5</sup> So all the days that Adam lived were nine hundred and thirty years; and he died.</p>   | <i>Adam</i>       | <i>130</i> | <i>Seth</i>                     | <i>800</i>   | <i>930</i>   |
| <b>2</b>   | <p><sup>6</sup> <b>Seth</b> lived one hundred and five years, and begot Enosh.</p> <p><sup>7</sup> After he begot Enosh, Seth lived eight hundred and seven years, and had sons and daughters.</p> <p><sup>8</sup> So all the days of Seth were nine hundred and twelve years; and he died.</p>  | <i>Seth</i>       | <i>105</i> | <i>Enosh</i>                    | <i>807</i>   | <i>912</i>   |
| <b>3</b>   | <p><sup>9</sup> <b>Enosh</b> lived ninety years, and begot Cainan.</p> <p><sup>10</sup> After he begot Cainan, Enosh lived eight hundred and fifteen years, and had sons and daughters.</p> <p><sup>11</sup> So all the days of Enosh were nine hundred and five years; and he died.</p>   | <i>Enosh</i>      | <i>90</i>  | <i>Cainan</i>                   | <i>815</i>   | <i>905</i>   |
| <b>4</b>   | <p><sup>12</sup> <b>Cainan</b> lived seventy years, and begot Mahalalel.</p> <p><sup>13</sup> After he begot Mahalalel, Cainan lived eight hundred and forty years, and had sons and daughters.</p> <p><sup>14</sup> So all the days of Cainan were nine hundred and ten years; and he died.</p>   | <i>Cainan</i>     | <i>70</i>  | <i>Mahalalel</i>                | <i>840</i>   | <i>910</i>   |
| <b>5</b>   | <p><sup>15</sup> <b>Mahalalel</b> lived sixty-five years, and begot Jared.</p> <p><sup>16</sup> After he begot Jared, Mahalalel lived eight hundred and thirty years, and had sons and daughters.</p> <p><sup>17</sup> So all the days of Mahalalel were eight hundred and ninety-five years; and he died.</p>   | <i>Mahalalel</i>  | <i>65</i>  | <i>Jared</i>                    | <i>830</i>   | <i>895</i>   |
| <b>6</b>   | <p><sup>18</sup> <b>Jared</b> lived one hundred and sixty-two years, and begot Enoch.</p> <p><sup>19</sup> After he begot Enoch, Jared lived eight hundred years, and had sons and daughters.</p> <p><sup>20</sup> So all the days of Jared were nine hundred and sixty-two years; and he died.</p>  | <i>Jared</i>      | <i>162</i> | <i>Enoch</i>                    | <i>800</i>   | <i>962</i>   |
| <b>7</b>   | <p><sup>21</sup> <b>Enoch</b> lived sixty-five years, and begot Methuselah.</p> <p><sup>22</sup> After he begot Methuselah, Enoch walked with God three hundred years, and had sons and daughters.</p> <p><sup>23</sup> So all the days of Enoch were three hundred and sixty-five years.</p> <p><sup>24</sup> And Enoch walked with God; and he <i>was</i> not, for God took him.</p>   | <i>Enoch</i>      | <i>65</i>  | <i>Methuselah</i>               | <i>[300]</i> | <i>[365]</i> |
| <b>8</b>   | <p><sup>25</sup> <b>Methuselah</b> lived one hundred and eighty-seven years, and begot Lamech.</p> <p><sup>26</sup> After he begot Lamech, Methuselah lived seven hundred and eighty-two years, and had sons and daughters.</p> <p><sup>27</sup> So all the days of Methuselah were nine hundred and sixty-nine years; and he died.</p>  | <i>Methuselah</i> | <i>187</i> | <i>Lamech</i>                   | <i>782</i>   | <i>969</i>   |
| <b>9</b>   | <p><sup>28</sup> <b>Lamech</b> lived one hundred and eighty-two years, and had a son.</p> <p><sup>29</sup> And he called his name Noah, saying, "This <i>one</i> will comfort us concerning our work and the toil of our hands, because of the ground which the LORD has cursed."</p> <p><sup>30</sup> After he begot Noah, Lamech lived five hundred and ninety-five years, and had sons and daughters.</p> <p><sup>31</sup> So all the days of Lamech were seven hundred and seventy-seven years; and he died.</p> | <i>Lamech</i>     | <i>182</i> | <i>Noah</i>                     | <i>595</i>   | <i>777</i>   |
| <b>10</b>  | <p><sup>32</sup> And <b>Noah</b> was five hundred years old, and Noah begot Shem, Ham, and Japheth.</p> <p>[<sup>29</sup> So all the days of Noah were nine hundred and fifty years; and he died. (Gen 9:29 NKJ)]</p>  | <i>Noah</i>       | <i>500</i> | <i>Shem<br/>Ham<br/>Japheth</i> | <i>[450]</i> | <i>950</i>   |

| 16  | <sup>20</sup> <b>Reu</b> lived thirty-two years, and begot Serug.<br><sup>21</sup> After he begot Serug, Reu lived two hundred and seven years, and begot sons and daughters.   | <i>Reu</i>      |     | <i>Serug</i>   |       |       |
| 17  | <sup>22</sup> <b>Serug</b> lived thirty years, and begot Nahor.<br><sup>23</sup> After he begot Nahor, Serug lived two hundred years, and begot sons and daughters.   | <i>Serug</i>    |     | <i>Nahor</i>   |       |       |
| 18  | <sup>24</sup> <b>Nahor</b> lived twenty-nine years, and begot Terah.<br><sup>25</sup> After he begot Terah, Nahor lived one hundred and nineteen years, and begot sons and daughters.   | <i>Nahor</i>    |     | <i>Terah</i>   |       |       |
| 19  | <sup>26</sup> Now <b>Terah</b> lived seventy years, and begot Abram, Nahor, and Haran.<br><sup>27</sup> This <i>is</i> the genealogy of Terah: Terah begot Abram, Nahor, and Haran. Haran begot Lot.<br><sup>28</sup> And Haran died before his father Terah in his native land, in Ur of the Chaldeans.<br><sup>29</sup> Then Abram and Nahor took wives: the name of Abram's wife <i>was</i> Sarai, and the name of Nahor's wife, Milcah, the daughter of Haran the father of Milcah and the father of Iscah.<br><sup>30</sup> But Sarai was barren; she had no child.<br><sup>31</sup> And Terah took his son Abram and his grandson Lot, the son of Haran, and his daughter-in-law Sarai, his son Abram's wife, and they went out with them from Ur of the Chaldeans to go to the land of Canaan; and they came to Haran and dwelt there.<br><sup>32</sup> So the days of Terah were two hundred and five years, and Terah died in Haran. | <i>Terah</i>    |     | <b>20<sup>th</sup> from Adam</b><br><i>Abram</i><br><i>Nahor</i><br><i>Haran</i> |       |       |

**OBSERVATIONS:**

This *is* the genealogy of Shem:

Shem was one hundred yeSars old,  
and begot Arphaxad two years after the flood.  
After he begot Arphaxad,  
Shem lived five hundred years,  
and begot sons and daughters.

Arphaxad lived thirty-five years,  
and begot Salah.  
After he begot Salah,  
Arphaxad lived four hundred and three years,  
and begot sons and daughters.

Salah lived thirty years,  
and begot Eber.  
After he begot Eber,  
Salah lived four hundred and three years,  
and begot sons and daughters.

Eber lived thirty-four years,  
and begot Peleg.  
After he begot Peleg,  
Eber lived four hundred and thirty years,  
and begot sons and daughters.

Peleg lived thirty years,  
and begot Reu.  
After he begot Reu,  
Peleg lived two hundred and nine years,  
and begot sons and daughters.

Reu lived thirty-two years,  
and begot Serug.  
After he begot Serug,  
Reu lived two hundred and seven years,  
and begot sons and daughters.

Serug lived thirty years,  
and begot Nahor.  
After he begot Nahor,  
Serug lived two hundred years,  
and begot sons and daughters.

Nahor lived twenty-nine years,  
and begot Terah.  
After he begot Terah,  
Nahor lived one hundred and nineteen years,  
and begot sons and daughters.

Now Terah lived seventy years,  
and begot  
Abram,  
Nahor, and  
Haran.

This *is* the genealogy of Terah:

Terah  
begot  
Abram,  
Nahor, and  
Haran.  
Haran begot  
Lot. And  
Haran died  
before his father Terah  
in his native land,  
in Ur of the Chaldeans.

Then Abram and Nahor took wives:  
the name of Abram's wife was Sarai, and  
the name of Nahor's wife, Milcah,  
the daughter of Haran  
the father of Milcah and  
the father of Iscah.  
But Sarai was barren;  
she had no child.

And Terah took  
his son Abram and  
his grandson Lot,  
the son of Haran, and  
his daughter-in-law Sarai,  
his son Abram's wife,  
and they went out with them  
from Ur of the Chaldeans  
to go to the land of Canaan;  
and they came to Haran  
and dwelt there.

So the days of Terah were two hundred and five  
years,  
and Terah died  
in Haran.
